Our long-term goal is to decrease the number and percent of children exposed to lead in their environments and to increase the volume of housing stock that is lead-safe or lead free.

OUR STRATEGY

Lead poisoning affects all of us, and we all need to take responsibility for addressing it. Whether in our housing, water or soil, we must act collectively to prevent and remediate lead hazards and the harmful effects of lead exposure on children and families. Dedicated resources are needed for lead testing in homes, screening children for lead in their blood, lead hazard control and abatement, community education and organizing, workforce development for lead professionals, increasing the supply of safe, affordable housing options, training in lead-safe work practices for property owners, contractors, and more.
