Community Benefit Trust Fund: Making a Difference in the Mon Valley?

Background

The U.S. Steel Community Benefit Trust was established as part of a June 2019 settlement with the Allegheny County Health Department over air pollution violations at Clairton Coke Works. This fund directs 90% of a \$2.7 million civil penalty to support five municipalities, with 10% allocated to the county's Clean Air Fund. The municipalities are Clairton, Glassport, Liberty, Lincoln and Port Vue.*

Public health and environmental programs were allotted just under 7% of all funding:

- \$130,000 to Port Vue for "environmental, public health and community benefit."
- \$51,668 for the purchase of public health and safety education equipment in Lincoln, as well as \$50,000 to construct a new salt shed.

The purpose of these projects is unspecified.

Where did the money go?

Funding Breakdown:


Recreation: \$1,357,068.77
Public Safety: \$854,268.81
Infrastructure: \$639,743.98
Blight/Housing: \$306,583.54
Public Health: \$231,667.86

Key Projects:

- \$404,500 for a new recreation center in Port Vue.
- \$250,000 for solar-powered cameras and streetlights in Clairton.
- \$200,000 for Lincoln park improvements.
